Magnet placements to be e-mailed first week in April

Families who applied for their student to attend an academic or career tech magnet program in the 2023-24 school year will be receiving an email notification about their student's status during the first week of April.

Parents of students who have received a seat in a magnet program will have to submit their acceptance by the date included in the email. Otherwise their seat will be made available to other students.

A waiting list will be established for eligible students who may not have received a seat in a magnet program. Families who did not submit an application during the first round will have another opportunity to apply for open seats in mid- to late-April. If eligible, their student would be placed on the bottom of the waiting list for their requested program.

Annual Kindergarten Roundup event set for April 26

Incoming kindergarten students and their families are invited to attend this year's Kindergarten Round-Up to learn about their new school and meet the staff.

Kindergarten Round-Up will be held on Wednesday, April 26 at 2 p.m. at all elementary schools that serve kindergarten students.

Families who aren't sure what school their child will be attending can call the Office of Student Assignment at (352) 955-7700 or visit www.sbac.edu/enrollment. That website includes information about how to enroll a child in school, including an incoming kindergartener, and a link to the

online enrollment form. Families will be able to begin that process on April 26.

After completing the form and before school begins on August 10, families will need to provide to their child's school copies of the child's birth certificate, immunization record, proof of a physical exam conducted in the last year, and two different proofs of residence in the parent's name.

Parents are encouraged to submit this information well before August 10. Schools are open during the summer break.

Free after-school tutoring includes state math test prep



The district's free, online after-school tutoring/homework help program is now offering additional support for students who will be taking the Algebra 1 or Geometry end-of-course (EOC) exams required for graduation by the state of Florida.

The tutoring will be offered Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 6-8 p.m. through May 11. A schedule outlining the topics that will be covered in each session is available at bit.ly/eoc_tutoring or through the QR code shown to the left.

Deadline to apply for college savings program is April 30
