Magnet program notifications going out March 25

Families who applied for their student to attend one of the district's academic or careertech magnet programs will be notified by email on Monday, March 25 whether or not their child has been offered a seat.

Families will be notified of their child's status through the email they included on their magnet application. For each magnet program they requested, they will be informed whether they've been offered a seat, are ineligible for that program, are on a waitlist, or are considered 'waitlist inactive'—meaning their child was admitted to a magnet program they had ranked as a higher choice.

If their child has been offered a seat in a magnet program, families must log in to the magnet system by Monday, April 1 to accept that seat. Families only have to take action if their child has been offered a seat. Complete instructions for accepting a seat will be included in the notification email.

Offers will continue to be made throughout the spring and summer as seats become available. Those offers will also come to the email addresses the family included in the application.

Annual Kindergarten Roundup set for April 24

Incoming kindergarten students and their families will have an opportunity to visit their new schools and meet school staff during the upcoming Kindergarten Roundup, which is set for April 24 at 2 p.m. at all schools that serve kindergarten students.

Families will also be able to start the online enrollment process for their incoming kindergartener on that date. The link to the enrollment application and a list of the documents needed to complete the registration process is available at www.sbac.edu/enrollment. Families are encouraged to enroll their children well before school begins on Monday, August 12.

Free parent coaching, support available to ACPS families

Alachua County Public Schools continues to offer free parent coaching for any ACPS family through its partnership with the national Cook Center and ParentGuidance.org.

The free service includes weekly calls with a dedicated coach and 24/7 app messaging with a response within 24 hours when needed. Families can also access other tools, including a variety of helpful videos and other content.

The Cook Center also provides free monthly webinars for all ACPS families. Those webinars are focused on mental health and related issues. They are typically held the final Thursday of each month at 6 p.m. and are available in both English and Spanish. Notices are also sent to parents through the Skylert parent notification system, emailed fliers distributed through the Peachjar platform and through the district's social media pages.



Families can sign up now through April 30 to save on college costs



Families have until April 30 to enroll their child in the Florida Prepaid College Program and save money on college tuition and fees by locking in costs for less. Monthly prices are now at their lowest level in 10 years.

Prepaid plans are guaranteed by the state, can be used at public and private colleges, trade and technical schools in and outside of Florida, and can be refunded or transferred to another family member.
