

ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Under Florida law, a student must be five years old on or before September 1 to enroll in kindergarten. A student must be six years old on or before September 1 and have successfully completed kindergarten to enroll in first grade.



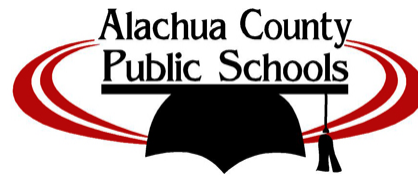
To register your child for school, you will need:

- Proof of child's name and age
- Child's Social Security card
- Two proofs of residency
- Florida certificate of immunization
- Proof of physical examination conducted within one year of enrollment

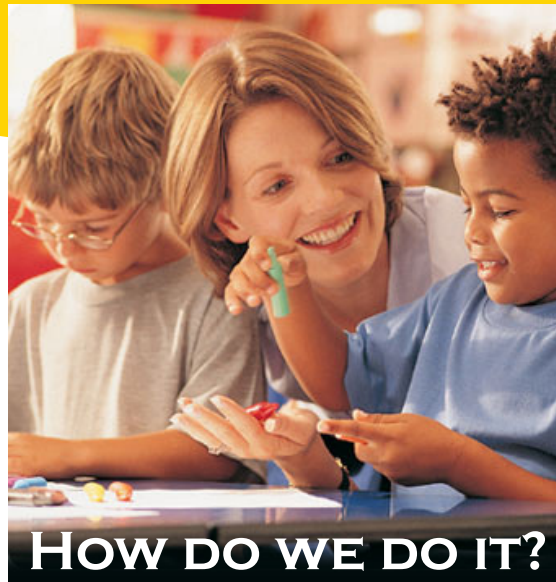
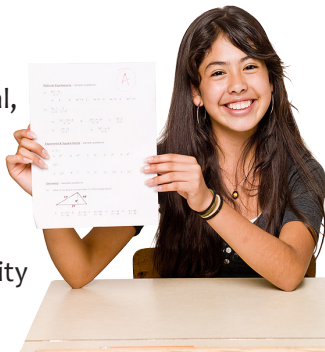
