Gifted Science

The differentiated curriculum will add breadth and depth to the academically gifted students' educational opportunities by exposing them to increasingly complex concepts that otherwise would not be included in their middle school experiences. These students will begin 6th grade by participating in science labs. By 8th grade they will be designing their own lab experiments. Our ultimate goal is to insure that our students are prepared for the rigors of a demanding high school science curriculum.



Gifted Social Studies

Gifted Social Studies classes are distinguished by acceleration, enrichment, sophistication, and novelty. Gifted Social Studies is enhanced by delving more deeply into topics of the prescribed curricula. Students' learning threads through 6th, 7th, and 8th grades, acquiring the research, higher-level thinking, and analytical skills they need in order to have a head start in the Honors, AP, IB, and Cambridge programs that are offered in Alachua County High Schools.



Advanced Math

Advanced mathematics' main goal is to prepare students for their first taste of categorical math: Algebra and Geometry. This is accomplished through enriching and real-world application problems and solutions that allow students to dig down into the most vital aspects of the subject.

R.E.A.C.H.

Students who meet the criteria and submit an application will have the opportunity to be considered for our R.E.A.C.H. Reading & Research and R.E.A.C.H. Language Arts classes in 6th grade. The R.E.A.C.H. program creates a distinctive middle school experience through cutting-edge technology and an integrated curriculum.

Students accepted into our R.E.A.C.H. program and who maintain at least a B average in both classes will continue this three-year program in 7th and 8th grade, giving them a head start for the rigorous programs of Alachua County high schools.
