When approaching a stopped school bus that has displayed a stop signal, you must stop and wait for the bus to withdraw its signal before proceeding. If there is a divided highway with an unpaved space of at least 5 feet, a raised median, or a physical barrier, a motorist who is traveling in the opposite direction of the bus is not required to stop.

If more than three days of school are missed, the district may have to add minutes to the school day after utilizing the scheduled Flex Days.



A Message from The Alachua County Sheriff's Office

Welcome to a new school year. Let's go over some quick safety topics.



The internet is everywhere; on cell phones, computers, and even your gaming systems. While the internet can be incredibly useful for researching information, communicating with your friends or playing games, it has a dark side – criminals that prey on kids. Practice safe habits online such as never giving out any personal information on pople online that you do not

the internet. Never talk to people online that you do not know well in real life. Do not go meet someone you met online. They might seem nice, but there is no guarantee that they are who they say they are. If someone online is making you feel uncomfortable, do not respond to them. Instead, go tell a trusted adult immediately. To learn more about staying safe online, visit NetSmartzKids, a program sponsored by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC). NetSmartzKids has games, activities, and videos all specifically designed to teach you how to protect your privacy and safety online. Check it out at **www. netsmartzkids.org.** A companion site, **www.nsteens.org**, is geared towards older children and teenagers. NSTeens contains videos, games, comics, and quizzes that address online safety and cyberbullying.

Get to know your school resource deputy. These highlytrained deputies are there not only to keep you safe, but to be a resource that you can turn to when you need help. They can also assist you with accessing some of the many programs offered through the Alachua County Sheriff's Office, such as Teen Driver Challenge, Teen Court, and the Explorers. They also lead the annual Washington, D.C., Safety Patrol Trip in June.
