7. <u>2014-15 Renewal of Annual Agreements with Carlton Palms Educational Center for Services</u> for Exceptional Students (Black)

Four (4) separate agreements have been prepared for annual renewal of services for four exceptional students who have been placed at Carlton Palms Educational Center in Mt. Dora, Florida, in cooperation with other public service agencies. The agreements cover intensive specialized educational services for students with significant developmental delays in accordance with their IEPs. Funds are based on the FTE generated for the students by their matrix of services and cost. Alachua County, as the home district for these students, is responsible for the educational portion of their services at this residential treatment center.

8. Consulting Agreement with Ro Educational Leadership (Caudle)

An agreement has been prepared with Ro Educational Leadership, LLC, to provide instructional leadership training and coaching for principals, APs, school-level leadership teams, and district-level leadership teams. Ro Educational Leadership will provide coaching/training, primarily, with teams at seven Title I schools, to include Duval, Lake Forest, Rawlings, Metcalfe, Waldo, and Shell Elementary Schools, and Hawthorne Middle/High School. Training and coaching will occur over a 16-day period beginning September 26, 2014, and conclude in May 2015. Total costs for services is \$48,000.

9. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for Teachers at Reichert (Caudle)

An MOU has been submitted to formalize a reimbursement agreement between the School Board of Alachua County and the City of Gainesville. The School Board of Alachua County, Florida, will reimburse the cost of up to three teachers who will provide instruction to elementary and secondary students at the Reichert House during after-school and summer programming. Costs for reimbursement will include both regular school year instruction and summer of 2015. Funding shall not exceed \$80,000.

10. 21st Century Grant Application: Project Flourish (Caudle)

A new, competitive proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for a 21st Century Community Learning Center grant for four elementary schools. This grant program, entitled Project Flourish, would provide after-school programs at Duval, Rawlings, Terwilliger, and Shell Elementary Schools. Program activities are designed to improve students' academic performance, particularly in reading, math and science, and to provide students with engaging activities in a safe environment during the time when school is not in session. Funds totaling \$567,463.20 will be used for teacher stipends and benefits, supplies, equipment, field trips, transportation for students, a project manager, and travel for required program meetings.

11. 21st Century Grant Application: Project Thrive (Caudle)

A new, competitive proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for a 21st Century Community Learning Center grant for four elementary schools. This grant program, entitled Project Thrive, would provide after-school program at Alachua, Idylwild, Lake Forest, and Metcalfe Elementary schools. Program activities are designed to improve students' academic performance, particularly in reading, math and science, and to provide students with engaging activities in a safe environment during the time when school is not in session. Funds totaling \$527,932.80 will be used for teacher stipends and benefits, supplies, equipment, field trips, transportation for students, a project manager, and travel for required program meetings.
