On June 16, 2015, the School Board approved Kail Partners, LLC, Gainesville, Florida, as the design professional for this project. ## 12. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) (Moore)

In March 2014, President Obama announced the launch of an exciting initiative to help ensure that more of Americas's students take the first step towards college success by completing the FAFSA form. School Counselors work diligently to assist Alachua County students and families in competing the FAFSA form. Currently the FAFSA completion rate for Alachua County is 39.4%, which is just above the state average of 38.8%. Board approval is requested for this new initiative which will allow counselors to better identify students who may need assistance completing the FAFSA form.

## 13. School Capacity (Moore)

In accordance with Policy 5120.03, *School Choice*, each year, the Board will establish 90% capacity for each school in the District. Schools have a project enrollment of less than 90% of capacity for the following school year and will be placed in controlled open enrollment. Projected enrollment will be calculated by taking the number of students zoned to the school, subtracting those students granted acceptance to magnet programs at other schools, adding students granted acceptance to magnet programs at the school, and adding students with continuing zoning exceptions.
