The School Board of Alachua County, Florida, met in regular session duly called at 6 p.m. in the Boardroom, 620 East University Avenue, Gainesville, Florida. Present were: Leanetta McNealy, Chairman; Eileen Roy, Vice-Chairman; April Griffin, Rob Hyatt, and Gunnar Paulson, members; Owen Roberts, Superintendent; and Ryan Gilbert, Board Attorney.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman McNealy. Musical entertainment was provided by the Rawlings Elementary School Chorus.

SCHEDULED AGENCIES

ALACHUA COUNTY MEDICAL SOCIETY AND THE ALACHUA COUNTY MEDICAL ALLIANCE Ms. Rosalyn Levy, President of the Alachua County Medical Alliance, and Dr. Sally Lawrence, Executive Director of the Alachua County Medical Society, addressed the Board regarding Project COACH (*Combatting Obesity for Alachua County's Health*) and the Weekly Wellness Walks.

Board members and Dr. Roberts spoke highly of this program.

ONE MILL OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

Mr. Perry McGriff, chairman of the One-Mill Oversight Committee, conducted the Annual Update to the Board. Committee members, community leaders Harvey Budd, Albert White and Janie Williams were also in attendance to show their advocacy for the one-mill programs.

The Update included background, responsibilities, expenditures, appropriations, magnet program funding, academic, career tech, and music honors; and classroom technology information.

Total one mill expenditures from July 2009 through December 2015 were \$67 million. That included teachers for Academic/Career Tech Magnets, elementary music and art, band and chorus, media specialists, guidance counselors and classroom technology.

Mr. McGriff expressed appreciation for Board leadership. He informed the Board that the committee is planning to take the Annual Report to the community to increase awareness of the significance of One-Mill funding.

Committee member Harvey Budd, who has a background in media, briefly addressed the Board, stating that there is a great story to tell about the One-Mill. He has ideas concerning "branding," creating a logo, and establishing an ongoing community awareness.

Mrs. Roy suggested the Ilene Silverman show as an avenue to pursue.

Mr. Hyatt stated that the success of the One-Mill is due to the Board's accountability to the voters.

Mr. McGriff emphasized that the committee makes sure the One-Mill dollars are being spent in accordance with the Ballot language.

Dr. Roberts agreed with Mr. Budd, stating that the One-Mill must be marketed so people understand the significance. He affirmed his support.

Dr. McNealy suggested showcasing students as part of the community effort and expressed confidence in the finished plan.

Mrs. Griffin attended the Career Academy Showcase at Gainesville High School, where the rollout of the new Education Academy at BHS was celebrated.

Mr. Hyatt expressed pride in his former student and now SFHS senior Joni Perkins on being the recipient of the Edna M. Hart *Keeper of the Dream* scholarship.

Dr. Roberts:

- attended the Career Academy Forum at BHS, where he was very impressed with the turnout and the quality of the program. He commended Dr. Dave Edwards, Career Tech Director, and his staff.
- reported that graduation rates were released, with Alachua County rising to 84% and six of the seven high schools rated as high performing. He commended all school leaders.
- congratulated Daniel Zheng, LMS, for a perfect score on a Mathematical Association of America annual competition. Also congratulated Jake Frazer, Talbot Elementary, for earning the highest score of any elementary student in Florida in that same competition. Both boys are coached by Will Frazer, national championship BHS Math Team coach.

Deputy Superintendent Hershel Lyons provided information on suicide prevention strategies that are being put in place at the schools. He also provided information on the Education Summit planned for instructional leaders, to be held June 10-11, 2015, which will also be open to Charter Schools.

Dr. Roberts commented on Boardroom improvements, expressing appreciation to Mr. Raymond Fayo, as well as the Instructional Technology Department for creating an improved environment for Board members to conduct their work.

Mrs. Roy commented on the excellent forum recently held in Alachua and the upcoming Education Foundation's fundraiser: *Night in the Big Apple*.

Dr. McNealy commended:

- Maria Maroll on being first runner up for the Martin Luther King Scholarship.
- Terry Robinson, who won the 2015 Martin Luther King Oratorical Contest.
- Dr. Candace White, for her outstanding work at several schools by helping students realize their dreams, setting goals, and discussing nutrition and the ABCs of success.
- teacher Latoria Mosley, Howard Bishop Middle School, and her students on a recent project.
