The School Board of Alachua County, Florida, met in regular session duly called at 6 p.m. in the Boardroom, 620 East University Avenue, Gainesville, Florida. Present were: Leanetta McNealy, Chairman; Eileen Roy, Vice-Chairman; April Griffin, Rob Hyatt, and Gunnar Paulson, members; Owen Roberts, Superintendent; and David Delaney, Board Attorney.

PLUM CREEK ENVISION ALACHUA

Dr. Roberts stated that he requested the Plum Creek presentation to receive updated information, as the community considers the Plum Creek project. He commented on the school district's association with the Chamber, Santa Fe College, and the University of Florida, in representing the interests of a premier education system.

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CITIZEN INPUT

Mr. Kali Blount, Black History Task Force, resumed an ongoing history lesson.

Mr. Ken Cornell, Alachua County Commissioner, greeted the Board at this first opportunity since his election. Mr. Cornell addressed the Board:

- Commending Dr. Roberts on his clear presentation at the Legislative Delegation meeting and expressed his support.

EXTENDING POST RETIREMENT CONTRACTS (DES)

Motion by Mrs. Griffin

Seconded by Mr. Hyatt

<u>Moved the</u> Superintendent's recommendation to approve his plan for addressing Post-DROP employment, as follows:

- Employees who are not currently in DES will not be eligible to enter DES, effective immediately.
- The five (5) current employees in DES will be eligible to return for the remainder of the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 fiscal year (6/30/2016), after which their employment will end.
- The four (4) employees who were rehired after spending a year with DES are eligible to return for the 2015-16 school year at mid-point on the salary schedule, after which their employment will end.
- Effective June 30, 2016, all DES contracts will expire.

CITIZEN INPUT

ACEA President Karen McCann reported on a Florida Education Association statewide initiative. A short survey titled *Assess the Test* can be found at the *FEA.org* website. The responses and comments from that survey will be sent to legislators. Mrs. McCann requested District assistance in getting the *Assess the Test* information to PTAs.

Mr. Kali Blount, Black History Task Force, continued his history lesson to the Board.

BOARD MEMBER/ SUPERINTENDENT REQUESTS

Dr. Paulson reported that this year there is a rebate of \$200,660 from the Florida School Board Insurance Trust. Last year's rebate was designated to the Contingency Fund. Dr. Paulson requested a nod of heads to agree to the same designation this year.

Mrs. Griffin informed Superintendent Roberts about the Student Government Leaders' Breakfast, which the Board has held the past couple of years. Dr. Roberts stated that he looks forward to attending this year's event.

When attending the Mayor's Address to the City, Chairman McNealy noticed that Mayor Braddy reiterated many of Dr. Roberts' initiatives and expressed an interest in partnering with them. Dr. McNealy requested that we take the opportunity to respond to the mayor's statement.

Dr. Roberts was pleased to know that the mayor is speaking about this publicly and stated that, through previous meetings, he feels a good partnership is developing.

Dr. Roberts responded to a question from Mrs. Roy about a Board update on the recent HR Review.
