APPROVAL OF MINUTES	The minutes of the June 19, 2013, One-Mill Committee meeting were approved.
FINANCIAL REPORT INFORMATION	Mr. Ward conducted a review of financial information, updated as of November 30, 2013. Included were:

DISCUSSION	Since Medicaid is used for school nurse salaries, those funds may be rolled into technology
	- Verification will be made that there are no exceptions to school nurse allocations.
	- SBAC pays over \$50,000 per year in tax collection fees.
	- The one-mill has allowed us to continue to bring excellence to our band programs, as evidenced by great success at competitions.
	- Mrs. Clarke provided some detail on magnet and vocational programs. She also explained various diploma designations.
	- Brief explanation of Lottery funds, which, for the most part, go to Bright Futures.
	Mr. McGriff reminded the group of the Annual Report to the School Board, which is an opportunity to tout the one-mill program and let the public realize the importance of what they have done. The Annual Report is tentatively scheduled for April15, 2014. Mr. McGriff would like Committee members to attend, as it may increase awareness of the importance of the one-mill.
	The hope was expressed that the state will soon begin to appropriately fund education.
