- Mrs. Hollinger briefly commented on the number of students at Lofton and the increasing numbers of schools with magnet programs.

Mr. Budd inquired about the number of total students enrolled in Magnet programs. Mrs. Hollinger will get that information to the Committee. She also noted that DOE only approves a request for a Magnet program if the program is considered High Need/High Wage.

In October, Mrs. Hollinger is bringing in a software platform to help third graders prepare for the FSA.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

Mr. White reported that he is out and about talking to groups about the importance of the One-Mill and what it would really mean if it did not pass. He is passionate about sharing accurate information with the community, so that people can see that the One-Mill is vital for our kids.

Mrs. Hollinger pointed out that Band, Chorus, Art, Media Specialists, Guidance Counselors at elementary and middle school level are not required by the state.

Mrs. Gallagher, who is a member of *Citizens for Strong Schools*, reported on the committee's plans for getting One Mill information out to the public through signs, TV and radio spots, T-shirts, etc. These projects are just now getting geared up.

There was general agreement of the One-Mill Oversight Committee members that it would be effective to have kids be part of ads.
