I can't tell you how glad we are to have our students back in school.

We are just past our midpoint for the first nine weeks, and learning is underway. Even though school looks quite a bit different this year than most, we are settling into new routines on our new campus as well as learning online. Together, we will S.O.A.R to Success this year.

COVID Update

We appreciate your support in helping us adhere to our COVID guidelines such as sending your children to school with a mask daily and keeping them home when they're not feeling well. At school, students are expected to wash their hands frequently and maintain social distancing. I'd like to give a special thanks to teachers and school staff for reminding students about social distancing, ensuring frequent cleaning protocols, and taking student temperatures daily. A new development is that playgrounds are now available for students during recess. Equipment will be sanitized several times per day. We expect to continue these protocols for the foreseeable future. Any changes to the current protocols will be communicated via email from the district office.

SKYWARD Family Access

You can stay apprised of your child's grades and attendance through Skyward Family Access. An email was sent to all parents on how to sign up. If you have not received an email or would like to update your email, please contact the front office.

Dismissal Changes

Please communicate with your child's teacher about changes to your child's after school plans. Please send in a note on the designated day so that the

teacher knows about the change. The front office can accept changes of dismissal in the event of an emergency. Your child's safety is our number one priority.

Our school participates in the Community Eligible Provision (CEP) school lunch program where all students may have a complimentary breakfast and lunch. We encourage all students to eat breakfast with us daily beginning at 7:15. Students who elect to bring their lunch may also participate.

Curriculum Update

Our school implements the district adopted core curriculum in ELA, math science, and social studies. All students have an extra hour of reading instruction daily. We use a variety of supplemental materials to customize learning for each child. This includes using iReady for Reading and Math. We monitor student progress monthly using iStation for Reading and Math. Due to the extended period of school closure, the district has included additional progress monitoring in core subjects.

FIRST GRADE NEWS

We are very excited to partner with the UF/IFAS Family Nutrition Program to provide weekly nutrition lessons for all first graders from October to December virtually during our science block. The YUM curriculum lessons cover ChooseMyPlate, food safety, and more.

Please continue to read with your child everyday and have your child practice their sight words and spelling words everyday. It is very important that students continue that practice at home so that they memorize those words and increase their automaticity and fluency. We suggest flashcards, copying their words with pencil, crayons, markers, or pens, and fun games such as using sidewalk chalk, paint, playdough, magnetic letters, or letter stamps to spell their words.

Also make sure your child is bringing their folder to school everyday and that you check their folder everyday as well to check for any important information that has been sent home.

SECOND GRADE NEWS

We are halfway through the first semester. The first nine weeks end on November 2nd. Students will receive report cards on November 12th. We encourage all parents/guardians to discuss their child's academic progress with them and schedule a virtual meeting with your child's teacher to discuss areas that require further growth. It is vital to celebrate your child's success with them as well as discuss strategies about ways to improve with

specific goals in mind. If you have not received The Second and Third Hundred Fry Words from your child's teacher, please request a copy. We are asking that you review these words daily with your child. It is important to practice and repeat! The more opportunities your child has to become familiar with these words; it promotes their confidence, reading comprehension, and increases their ability to identify context clues. In addition, we are asking that each child reads for 20 minutes daily and complete their homework assignments.

Parental/Guardian academic engagement is essential for student success. When parents are involved in their child's education, their child is more persistent when implementing challenging tasks. Also, please continue to model effective reading strategies when working with your child at home.

All students both brick and mortar and Digital Academy (DA) are required to take a Mini AIMS Math assessment by Tuesday October 6. If your child is brick and mortar, he/she will take the test during the day at school. If your child is in Digital Academy, he/she must sign into Schoolspire to complete the assessment. Students can access Schoolspire through myPortal at sbac.edu. Overall, parents thank you for your continued support with your child's education during these trying times. Stay safe!

THIRD GRADE NEWS

Parents or Guardians,

Third grade would like to thank parents and guardians for all of the support thus far. We have several important reminders for the months of November and December. In November, students will be taking the first district-wide assessment (AIMS) for math, ELA, and science. Continue to support your child by reading daily, completing homework, and if you're able to, log into **iReady** and **iStation** for more support. Always feel free to contact your child's teacher to check on their progress in class. In Reading we have learned about asking and answering questions, finding the central message of a story, finding the main idea of an informational text and more. In math, we have covered place value, adding/subtracting strategies, and started multiplication/division. Be sure your child is practicing multiplication facts. Start off easy (x1s, x2's, x5's), then go on to the more difficult facts. In November, schools are closed for the Thanksgiving break from November 23rd through November 27th. Also, we will go on winter break from December 21st through January 1st. Please, continue to reinforce academic skills at home through any extended break.
