Service": "The Bid states..."Bidder shall have at time of Bid due date, adequate organization, technical expertise, equipment, facilities, supervisory capability, qualified personnel, and technical tools of the trade to ensure competent, prompt, and efficient service on a District-wide basis in support of this contract.

Gator Moving & Storage

It is the opinion of the SBAC that quantity of qualified personel available under this contract is insufficient to complete scope of work within timeline proposed by the SBAC. It is the determination of the Purchasing Department that Bid is non-responsive. Bid/Bidder were not futher evaluated to determine if responsive/responsible.
