"I'm so grateful to have the opportunity to be part of band," she said. "We get to create something together, we're not competing against each other, and that's a great feeling. Music really brings people together.

"Her amazing work ethic really sets her apart," said Graben. "She has exceptional musical talent coupled with just immense determination."
