Greetings Duval Families,

I hope you all enjoyed your Thanksgiving Holiday!

Interim/progress reports for the second nine weeks will be available in Skyward on Tuesday, December 15th. Teachers are in the process of scheduling conferences with parents for the next two weeks. If you do not hear from your child's teacher, please contact the school to set up a conference.

We have three weeks of school in December before the Winter break begins. During this time, we will be working hard to ensure each student masters the content they are supposed to learn during this second nine weeks period. When students return from the Winter break, they will be taking several assessments: Istation (for Reading and Math), District AIMS tests (for Reading and Math), and Dibels. All of these assessments provide us with vital information so that we can further help your child. I will be meeting with each teacher to discuss each student's scores on all of the above-mentioned assessments. During these discussions, we will be ensuring that the specific instruction that each child needs will be implemented. Further, I will be contacting parents of students who are not making adequate progress to examine ways to help your child meet grade level expectations.

Finally, I would like to stress the importance of our students learning sight words. Kindergarten students should know at least 100 sight words by the end of the school year. We will certainly be doing more in the classrooms to help students improve in this area. We also need your help. Please be sure to have your child review and practice reading the sight words on the sight word list that is in their homework folder. There is a new list this nine weeks. Your child knowing these words will help them be successful readers.
