I can't believe that we are embarking on the second half of the school year. During this second half (which officially begins on February 1st), our teachers will be working hard to ensure that all students are working at or above grade level. We have a few new academic Kindergarten requirements that will be implemented, which include the following:

- <u>Spelling Tests</u>
  - o 5 words
  - o 1 Sentence (which will be dictated to the students)
    - Students will be marked on capitalization, punctuation, and spelling
- Oral Reading Fluency Tests
  - o Grade-Level Reading Passages
  - o 1-minute timings on passages

Spelling tests and Oral Reading Fluency tests will be administered to students every 2 weeks beginning Friday, February 12th. Please be sure to review spelling words with your child so that s/he is successful on each test.

As we begin the New Year, I wanted to share some great **reading goals** with you. Most of your kiddos are actually reading words, phrases, and even sentences now, so it is vital that reading goals are set and updated regularly. Praise your children for their efforts and let the see that you are involved in their success!!

The new calendar year offers the opportunity to think about the past and set goals for the future. This should include family reading goals! Take time with your child to:

- Review favorite books or stories from the past year. If the books are nearby, look through them together. Have your child pick his 3 favorites. Ask, "What was the best part of this story? Why?" or "What is your favorite picture in this book?"
- **Discuss future reading plans.** How much time are family members spending on reading for pleasure? Are there ways you and your child can improve your reading habits? Together, write any ideas or goals you may have. Post them in a place where you can see them often.
- **Plan to read new things.** In addition to books, suggest your child read magazines, newspapers, cookbooks, catalogs--anything and everything that he can get his hands on!
