SIEMEN AWARD WINNERS

The annual award honors up to 100 of America's top performers in Advanced Placement (AP) science and math courses. The College Board, which coordinates the AP Program, selects one male and one female student from each state based on the

number of AP courses and tests they take and their success in the program.

Guidance Notes

2013-2014 COURSE REGISTRATION

Registration for the 2013-2014 school year began in April, with middle school teachers talking with their students about possible course selections, and ends in May, with final registration for all students. It is critical that parents be involved with their students in this process. Decisions made will have far-reaching effects, and it is important that parents and students give careful consideration to the choices available.

Registration for students at Buchholz is a two-step process. Each student receives a Program of Studies (which is also available on the BHS Guidance website). In the spring, Buchholz teachers register students for English, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies classes as well as selected electives. Registration for these classes is based on teacher recommendations.

In mid-March, students registered for their remaining courses. Buchholz has made a commitment to resolve all conflicts prior to the opening of school in August. To facilitate this process, students should have selected two year-long alternate courses (or the equivalent) at the time of registration. If the use of an alternate course resolves a scheduling conflict, the alternate is added to a student's schedule. This process makes the selection of alternate courses extremely important, since they may actually be used. If a student has a serious conflict, contact is made during the summer to ask for other choices, provided the school has a current phone number.

If parents and students wish to override a teacher's recommendation in the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, or Social Studies, parents should seek a waiver from the Assistant Principal for Curriculum. **The window of time for processing waivers is from May 31 through June 27**. All other requests for changes in course selections may also be made at this time through the guidance office. However, it is important to note that <u>after June 27</u>, 2013 no requests for a change may be made. Since the district requires completion of the master schedule very early, the deadline for changes is firm.

When school starts in August, the only student/parent generated requests for change permitted are the following: 1) the student has already received credit for the course in which he/she is enrolled, 2) the student needs a credit in a course in order to meet graduation requirements (applies to seniors only) or 3) the student needs a course in order to meet the requirements of a state scholarship program such as Bright Futures (applies to seniors only).

Florida End-of-Course (EOC) Assessments

The Florida EOC Assessments are part of Florida's Next Generation Strategic Plan for the purpose of increasing student achievement and improving college and career readiness. EOCs will be computer-based, criterion-referenced assessments that measure the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards for specific high-school level courses, as outlined in the course description. 9th & 10th graders must score 3 or higher to get credit 11th graders 30% of grade

9th graders must score a 3 or higher to get credit 10th graders 30% of grade

Online Course requirement

Students who entered ninth grade in 2011 -2012 (class of 2015) and after must complete at least one course through online learning. This requirement can be met using Alachua eSchool or Florida Virtual School.

One course means the entire course. If the course consists of 2 semesters you must complete both semesters. You may choose a 1 semester course to satisfy your requirement (ie Driver's Ed, Life Management Skills).

2013- 2014 RESERVED PARKING INFORMATION

There are 242 reserved paved parking spaces and 130 unpaved parking spaces available. Each year the number of BHS students changes. Therefore, each year there is a different challenge to park all students that wish to park on campus. Parking is a privilege, not a right and to gain that privilege students must meet certain requirements and follow certain procedures. Seniors can buy parking decals on a first come first serve basis, starting on August 14th. To be a senior, you must have at least 16 credits. You must have a 2.0 GPA and you must also not have any debts owed to Buchholz High School. So make sure you turn in all books! Something new this year is that dual enrolled students who have a class on BHS campus will be required to purchase a grass decal and the area by the tennis courts to the security trailer will be reserved for dual enrolled students. Cost for a dual enrolled decal will be \$15.

You can pick up forms in the front office or print them from the website. Below are the important dates:

August 14th - Senior Early Bird Day 8:00am—11:00am— everyone that comes this day gets a paved spot. It takes us about a minute to process each person, so rather than wait in a long line, we pass out numbers at 8:00am and then you are welcome to come back at a time when your number will come up.

August 15th- New Sr. Day- Seniors new to BHS that attend the orientation will be able to purchase a parking permit during the orientation. Students must attend orientation to purchase a decal.

August 20th - Senior Day 2:50 - 4:00 Seniors come to purchase and pick up decal

August 21st - Junior Day 3:00pm - 5:00 pm Coaches and Band can a give list of students involved in practice to Ms. Journey. Participants on the list can turn in forms and \$ during school and then pick up a decal for unpaved parking after practice. Participants wanting a paved spot must stand in line or have a parent or friend select the spot for them. No students can line up before school is out.

If any decals remain after this day, they will be sold on a first come, first serve basis. This past year we did not sell out of decals. If we do sell out of spaces, students may also put their name on a waiting list that will also operate on first come, first serve basis.

The ceremony will last approximately an hour and a half. There is ample seating; therefore the doors for admission will open only one hour before the ceremony. Security personnel will check all bags. Signs, noise makers, balloons and other disruptive materials should not be brought to the ceremony and will be confiscated by the O'Connell Center staff.
