*What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our schools. The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child.

*How Title I Works?

US Dept. of Ed provides funds to FL DOE. FL DOE allocates funds to districts. Districts identifies eligible schools and allocates funding to those schools. Schools spend the funds based on their SIP. Our school implements a school wide program. This means our Title I money is used in ways that may impact every student in the school.

*Title I Funds Provide Supplemental Support

Services provided through Title I funding at our school include: additional teachers for intervention instruction, technology (Laptops & software), curriculum materials (Acaletics), extended day tutoring (after school, Saturday school, extended school year, etc.)

*Who decides how funds are used?

Parents, staff, and administrators. If you would like to be involved in our decision making process, we encourage you to attend our SAC and/or PTA meetings, as well as, provide us feedback on the evaluation forms provided at every Parent and Family event. Like K-2 Literacy Night is October 13th. Our first official SAC meeting was today.
