In STEAM for November we will be working on activities that relate to properties of matter. For the STEAM challenge for this unit, students will use different materials to manipulate how much water can be held on different sized coins. They will work together to record and accurately chart their data to reinforce math and data analysis skills. Students will also be playing a game that relates to the different states of matter, as well as using typing.com games and quizzes to learn more typing and tech readiness skills. Last month, Mrs. McDonald's, Ms. McKinzie's, and Mrs. Cole's classes won the planet earth escape room reward for their respective grades. 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Third Grade News

Fall is here! We are now in our third unit in ELA "Government for the People." We are learning about our rights, what it takes to be a good citizen, and our responsibilities. We are studying and understanding how to read timelines, and identify cause and effect. We are still practicing how to be "power readers," ask questions as we read, annotate our texts, and other "power reading" strategies. In math we are learning multiplication and division. We are applying those inverse operations in this new chapter. Science is teaching us about the earth, stars and gravity. We will be moving into properties of matter in our next unit. Social studies is following along with our reading unit teaching us about government and citizenship, and our rights and responsibilities. We are getting ready to take our second Acaletics scrimmage test, so we are excited about another "Green Party." Reading is an important part of being successful in third grade, so we should be reading daily at home. Please be sure to check your child(s) agendas nightly and initial each day.

Fourth Grade News

This month in math, we are working on multiples, factors, and understanding fractions. Keep practicing multiplication facts through twelve at home. For our current unit in ELA, we are studying "Government in Action." For our grade-level theme board, we are looking for examples of government in our lives, such as social studies and literature. Make sure students are reading for thirty minutes each night. Children who read thirty minutes a day are being exposed to at least two million words per year and are twice as likely to be successful at their gradelevel expectations. We are writing informative essays from provided passages, focusing on citing evidence and elaborating. In science, we are studying matter and its changes, then energy and its uses. Fourth graders are also getting to grow fresh produce for the cafeteria in our school garden. We have worked hard to weed, fertilize, and plant our fall crops. We will spend November caring for our crops: collards, lettuce, kale, carrots, and radishes. We cannot wait to harvest them!

Fifth Grade News

We have a lot to be thankful for in the month of November! We will begin with celebrating all of those students who met their goal on the math Acaletics scrimmage. We cannot wait for the glow-in-the-dark dance party! We will look for students to increase their score by ten percent for the next scrimmage. In science, we are continuing to learn about matter and all of the different ways we mix and separate the different forms. In reading, we are looking at different literary texts and really focusing on annotating the text while we read so we can get a better understanding of the story. Students are always encouraged to work on iStation and iXL at home. These are programs that are standards aligned and will help increase their achievement in school. The fifth grade spelling bee will take place at the beginning of December, so look for more information to come your way very soon. We are very thankful for each of our fifth grade students and their families!
