Gainesville High students qualify for state health competition

Thirty-one students from the Gainesville High School Academy of Health Professions have qualified to compete in the upcoming State Leadership Conference for HOSA, an organization for future healthcare professionals.

The students all earned top-three finishes in their categories during the recent regional conference, which included more than 560 competitors from 21 high schools. Fourteen of the GHS students took first place in their categories, which cover subjects



ranging from biomedical laboratory to pathophysiology to medical photography.

According to the HOSA website, the competitions are designed to "provide a system for recognizing the competencies developed by members through Health Science and Biomedical Science class instruction, related job training, and HOSA related activities."

Students competed in both team and individual events to qualify for the state conference, which will be held in Orlando in early April. Participants then have the opportunity to earn the right to compete in the HOSA International Leadership Conference in Houston in late June.

The Academy of Health Professions was launched at GHS in 1993. In 2008 it became the first professional career academy in the district. The focus is to provide experience for students interested in pursuing technical training in health-related careers.
