- *The FASFEPA Vivian Scott Scholarship.* This scholarship offers \$1,500 to students interested in becoming a teacher. If interested in applying, please see your school counselor. The application requirements include:
  - Seniors on track to graduate
  - Eligible for Free or Reduced lunch
  - 300-word essay about why
  - 3 letters of recommendation from Principal, Teacher, and a Community Member
- The Alachua Audubon Society is offering the *John Kintermister High School Scholarship*. For additional information visit their website at [www.alachuaaudubon.org/scholarship](http://www.alachuaaudubon.org/scholarship). The deadline to apply is March 31, 2021. The \$300 award will be based on the following criteria:
  - Keen interest in the environment, nature, and/or conservation
  - Involvement in extracurricular environmental/nature activities
  - Academic record
  - Teacher/counselor recommendation
- *The A. Quinn Jones, Sr./Andrew R. Mickle Scholarship:* awards three \$1000 Scholarships to male seniors. Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:
  - Male
  - Graduating high school senior who has applied to one or more accredited college or university
  - Enrolled at least part-time during the Summer or Fall 2021 semester
  - Must have an unweighted cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher through their first semester (first two nine weeks) of their senior year

Submit a typed written essay on why the applicant should receive the scholarship award. Applications are available in the front office. Deadline April 2, 2021.

- *Clay Electric Cooperative 2021 Youth Scholarship.* Clay Electric will award a \$1,500 scholarship to one Buchholz student. To be eligible you must live in a home that is served by Clay Electric, write an essay to explain why you should receive a \$1,500 scholarship, and submit a letter of recommendation. The application is available in the front office. Deadline to apply is April 5, 2021.
- *Anne Ford and Allegra Ford Thomas Scholarships* are awarded to graduating high school seniors who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement, engagement in their school and community, and leadership for others with learning disabilities and attention issues. The [Allegra Ford Thomas Scholarship](#) is a \$5,000 scholarship (\$2,500/year over two years) awarded to a student who will be enrolled in a two-year community college, a vocational or technical training program, or a specialized program for students with LD and/or ADHD in the fall. The [Anne Ford Scholarship](#) is a \$10,000 scholarship (\$2,500/year over four years) for a student who will be enrolled in a full-time bachelor's degree program in the fall. For more information visit [National Center for Learning Disabilities](#). Deadline to apply is April 5, 2021.
- *We the Students Essay Scholarship.* Write a 500-800-word essay about the prompt: *What is the relationship between Equality and Justice?* Winners are eligible for up to a \$20,000 scholarship. For more information visit: <https://billofrightsinstitute.org/we-the-students-essay-contest> Deadline is April 15, 2021.
- *The Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Scholarship:* The Gainesville Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority will award 4 \$1,000 scholarships to deserving African American seniors in Alachua and Columbia County. Applicants must write a 750-word essay describing their most meaningful achievements and how that relates to their chosen field of study and their future goals. Application are available in the front office. Postmark deadline is April 30, 2021.
- *Brooks Law Group Scholarships.* First place will earn a \$1,000 scholarship and second place will earn a \$250 scholarship. Applicants may write a 700 to 1400-word essay on the topic: *Why do you think the student debt crisis has gotten so extreme? How has the debt problem affected your education plans?
