The CIT program is designed to help motivated rising 10th through 12th grade high school students receive leadership training and earn volunteer hours while assisting with <u>College</u> <u>for Kids</u>, a summer program for middle school students. This unique experience gives participants an understanding of commitment and the need for positive relationships with peers and adults as it correlates to teamwork.
