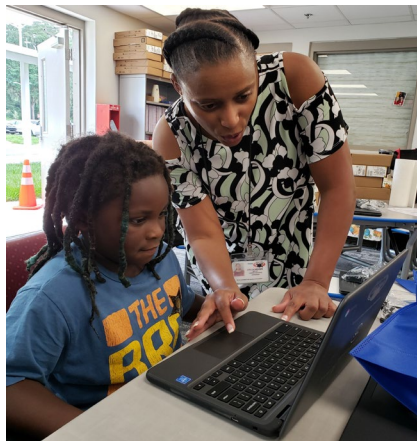
Internet-connected laptops still available for student use at home

Families of *all* students attending schools operated by Alachua County Public Schools can now request a laptop with free Internet access guaranteed through the end of the school year. There are NO eligibility requirements. If a student could benefit from having a laptop to do schoolwork at home, families are encouraged to request one. There is no charge for the use of the laptop, which the student will be able to keep until they leave the district.

The laptops have the same content filters as school computers and are accessed through the user names and passwords students use at school.

To request a laptop, families can go to <https://www.sbac.edu/ecf>. They would then click on the 'Application' button and complete an application for each student. Then they can click on 'Parent Orientation' to watch a 7-minute video and answer a few questions. This can easily be done on a cell phone.

Parents can pick up their child's laptop on Wednesday, November 9 from 2 to 8 p.m. at the District Office (620 E. University Ave.) Parents should have completed the application/orientation process before arriving, but if necessary can do so at the event. If they cannot make the event, they can contact their child's school to make the arrangements to pick-up a device.



School days, minutes added due to Hurricane Ian

The district's school year calendar and the hours at most schools serving elementary students have been changed to make up for the three instructional days lost to Hurricane Ian.

To meet state requirements, the two 'flex days' built into the calendar, including January 3 and February 20, will now be regular school days. Flex days are intended to be used to make up time lost to severe weather or other emergencies.

Ten instructional minutes are also being added to early-release Wednesdays at most schools with elementary-age students for the rest of the school year. Even with the use of flex days, instructional time for 4th and 5th graders didn't meet state requirements. The revised hours will apply to all students at the affected schools, including kindergarten-through-3rd grade students.

Free after-school K-12 tutoring/homework available online



Students and families are encouraged to take advantage of the district's free online tutoring/homework help service Beyond the Bell, available Mondays through Thursdays. Elementary students can access help from 3-4 p.m. and 6-7 p.m. in language arts, math, science and social studies. Support is available for middle and high school students from 6-7 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays for language arts and math, with tutoring in science and social studies available Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6-7 p.m.

Students can access Beyond the Bell at www.sbac.edu/tutor. They should select the appropriate grade level, select 'Click here to go to tutoring,' then log on to myPortal with the same Active Directory user name and password they use to log in to computers at school.
