District issues new December school calendar; schools will now be closed Friday, Dec. 22

Alachua County Public Schools has revised its plans for making up the two school days lost to Hurricane Idalia in August.

Originally the district planned to use both Thursday, December 21 and Friday, December 22 as make up days. Both were listed as 'flex days' in the 2023-24 school year calendar distributed in February.

However, the district has revised that plan. Under the new December school calendar:

- Wednesday, December 20 will now be a full school day for elementary schools (as well as middle and high schools), with no early release.
- Thursday, December 21 will be a regular school day for all schools.
- Friday, December 22 will be a student/teacher holiday and schools will be closed.

Notification about the make up days was sent to families through email and phone and through text for those families that have opted in to the text messaging system. To opt in, parents/guardians can text 'Y' or 'YES' to 67587 using a cell phone on file with their child's school.

Transportation changes take effect January 16, 2024

Because of the ongoing shortage of bus drivers and the impact of that shortage on bus schedules and school attendance, the district is making changes to its bus transportation system. The goals are to significantly reduce the number of late and non-arriving buses and use public funds more effectively.

Under the new system, 'courtesy' buses for all students except those attending the highest needs elementary schools will be eliminated beginning January 16 of 2024. Courtesy buses are those provided to students who live within two miles of their zoned school and are not part of the Exceptional Student Education (ESE) program.



The district is also revising the current system for transporting students who attend magnet and other choice programs not located at their zoned school. The current system of 'hub' stops for those students will be updated to increase efficiency and reduce the number of buses needed to transport magnet/choice students. Those changes will also take effect January 16.

Information has been sent to the families of magnet/choice and courtesy busing students. More detailed information on new magnet stop locations is already available at www.sbac.edu/magnetbusing. Proposed rezoning maps for elementary schools revised

In response to public input and other factors, the proposed maps for the rezoning of the district's elementary schools have been revised. No new revisions have been made to middle or high school maps, although that could change before the School Board votes on a comprehensive rezoning plan for all schools in early December.

All current proposed maps are posted on the district's website at www.sbac.edu/rezoning. That site also includes charts showing the potential impact of the maps on the student population at each school, answers to frequently asked questions about rezoning and other information.

A public hearing on rezoning has been scheduled for November 14 at 6 p.m. at the District Office (620 E. University Ave.). The School Board is scheduled to vote on the comprehensive rezoning plan during its regular meeting on December 5 at 6 p.m. The new plan would take effect in the fall of 2024.
