

Current Operational Cost


CURRENT TRANSPORTATION OPERATIONAL COST AND %

Choice and Magnet Programs

- 1 to 2 Hub Stops per zoned school.
- Restructure Magnet Programs

Courtesy

- Eliminate current courtesy ridership program (except SI sites).
- Implement a Hazardous Walking Program for funding.


Cost Reduction Scenarios

Remove Courtesy Riders
 approximately \$1.8M Reduction

 Remove Courtesy Riders and Reduce Magnet/Choice Stops
 approximately \$2.9M Reduction

Hazardous Walking/Bus Stop Conditions

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Only complete this form if your student(s) reside within 2 miles of their school and if you feel that the walking path for your student is unsafe, and that it meets the requirements for hazardous walking conditions as found in Florida Statutes Chapter 1006.23.

Your completed form will be reviewed by the appropriate school district department, or forwarded to the appropriate jurisdictional authority, and a decision will be made based on the completion of the review.


You will be notified via email of the final decision as soon as possible.



Hazardous Committee

Florida State Statute 1006.23 Hazardous walking conditions requires review when a request is made by the district school superintendent with respect to a road over which a state or local governmental entity has jurisdiction concerning a condition perceived to be hazardous to students in the district who live within the 2-mile limit and who walk to school.
